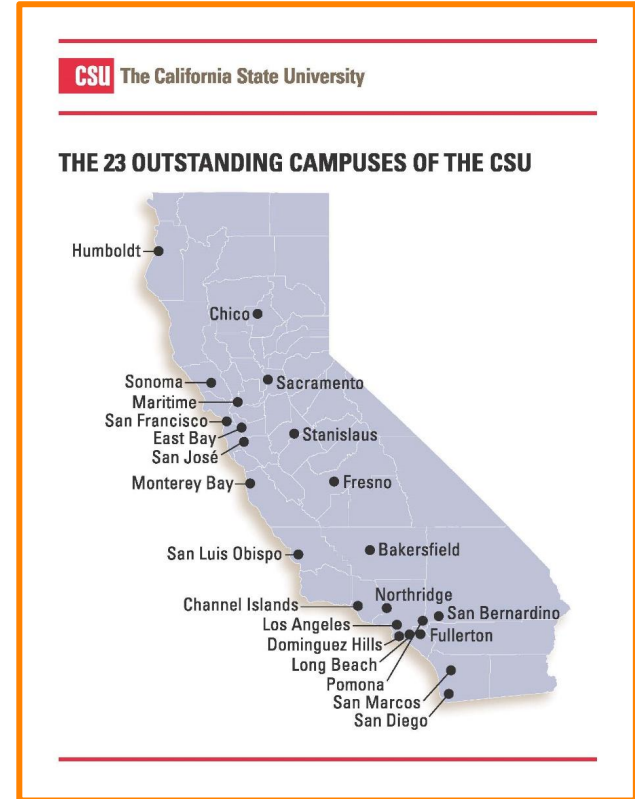
# University of California (UC)

- 10 campuses in CA – only 9 open for undergraduates
- Focuses more on research
- Minimum GPA is 3.0
- Acceptance based on:
  - A-G Courses and GPA
  - Extracurricular Activities and Involvement
  - Personal Statement
- Impacted Majors will have stricter requirements
- Applications accepted senior year from October 1<sup>st</sup> to November 30<sup>th</sup>
  - Application opens in August....start early!
  - Fee Waiver = 4 Free Applications



# California State University (CSU)

- 23 Campuses
- Focuses more on practical hands-on training
- Minimum GPA is 2.5
- Acceptance based on:
  - A-G Courses and GPA
- Applications accepted from October 1<sup>st</sup> to November 30<sup>th</sup>
  - Fee Waiver = 4 FREE APP'S
- Impacted Campuses will have stricter requirements

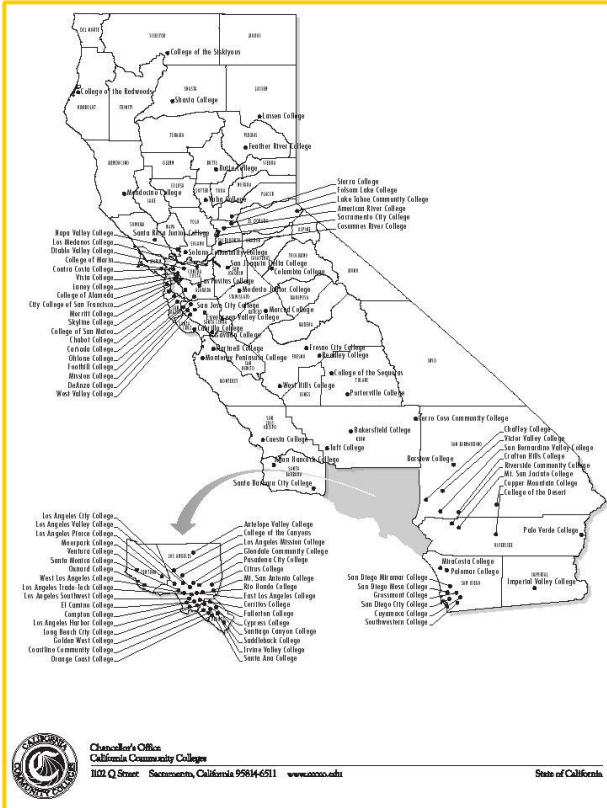


# California Private/Independent Colleges & Universities

- 85 Campuses throughout California ([aiccu.edu](http://aiccu.edu))
- Provide large scholarship/financial aid packages
- Smaller class size and faster graduation rates
- Target students that are of good academic standing and in line with the school mission
- Requirements and Deadlines will VARY
- Many use the Common App, 805 use it nationwide.

# What Are Majors and Degrees?

- Majors are courses of study in college.

## **Associate's Degree:**

2 year degree awarded by Community College (\*you do not have to have an associates degree, and can continue to go to Bachelors degree without it). *Not awarded at a 4 Year University*

## **Bachelor's Degree:**

4 year degree awarded by 4 Year Universities (UCDavis, Sac State, etc). Typically a minimum of 120 units required

## **Master's Degree:**

Additional study in a specialized field after obtaining a Bachelor's degree, typically 2-4 years on top of Bachelor's Degree (\*you can skip the Master's if you want or allowed for PhD programs)

## **Professional Degree / Doctorate:**

Specialization in specific areas, typically between 3-10 years. Require Bachelor degrees prior to getting into these programs (including medical school, law school, etc)



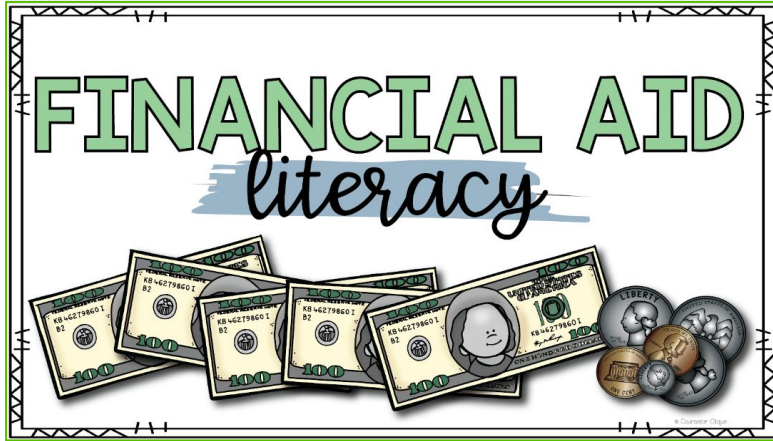

# What is Financial Aid?

Financial Aid is a term used to encompass school loans, grants, work study, and scholarships to help pay for post high school education.



## What is the FAFSA?

- The Free Application for Federal Student Aid is an application that is submitted before **EACH** year of college. The application opens October 1st (of 12th grade) and needs to be completed before March 2nd. The application is submitted to be eligible for Cal Grants, Pell Grants, Federal Loans (*typically lower interest rates than private loans*) and **MUST** be submitted to be eligible for the 2 years of free tuition at California Community Colleges.

## What is the CADAA?

- The California Dream Act Application allows students interested in attending eligible California Colleges, Universities, and Career Education Programs to apply for state financial aid. It is submitted before **EACH** year of college. The application opens October 1st (of 12th grade) and needs to be completed before March 2nd. This application is unrelated to the federal Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program.

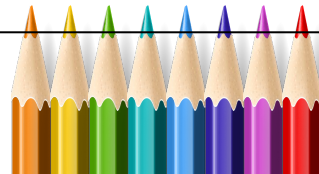

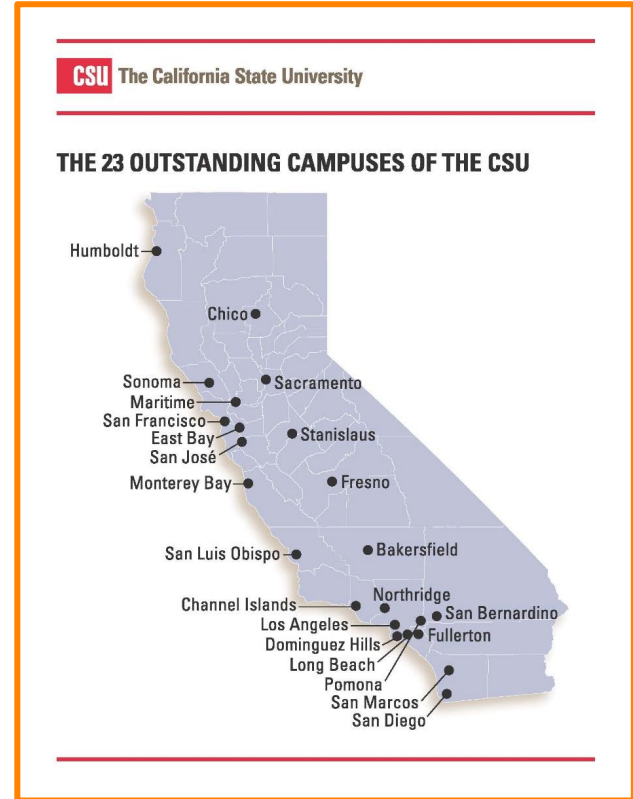

# ¿Qué son las especialidades y los títulos?

Las especialidades son cursos de estudio en la universidad.

## Associate's Degree:

“**Título de 2 años**” otorgado por Community College (\*no es necesario tener un título de asociado y puede continuar para obtener una licenciatura sin él)

## Bachelor's Degree:

“**Título de 4 años**” otorgado por universidades de 4 años (UC Davis, Sac State, etc.). Normalmente se requiere un mínimo de 120 unidades

## Master's Degree:

Estudios adicionales en un campo especializado después de obtener una licenciatura, generalmente de 2 a 4 años además de la licenciatura (\*puede omitir la maestría si lo desea o si está permitido para programas de doctorado)

## Professional Degree / Doctorate:

Especialización en áreas específicas, normalmente entre 3 y 10 años. Requerir títulos de licenciatura antes de ingresar a estos programas (incluida la facultad de medicina, la facultad de derecho, etc.)

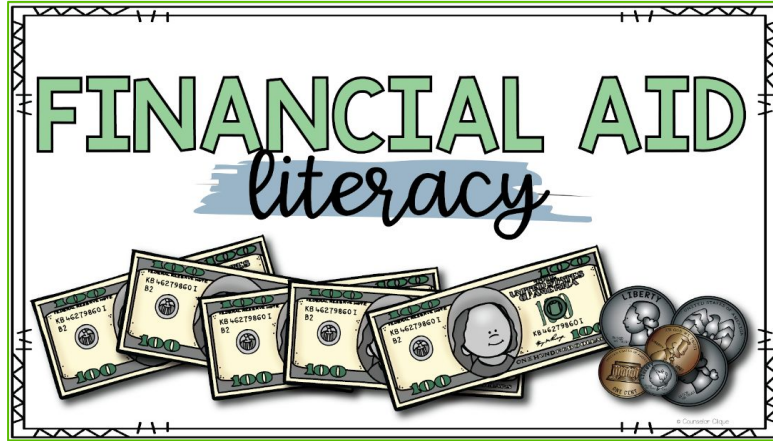

# ¿Qué es la ayuda financiera?

Ayuda financiera es un término que se utiliza para abarcar préstamos escolares, subvenciones, trabajo, estudio y becas para ayudar a pagar la educación posterior a la escuela secundaria.



## ¿Qué es La FAFSA?

- La Solicitud Gratuita de Ayuda Federal para Estudiantes es una solicitud que se presenta antes de CADA año de universidad. La solicitud se abre el 1 de octubre (de 12.º grado) y debe completarse antes del 2 de marzo. La solicitud se envía para ser elegible para Cal Grants, Pell Grants, préstamos federales (generalmente tasas de interés más bajas que los préstamos privados) y DEBE presentarse para ser elegible para los 2 años de matrícula gratuita en los colegios comunitarios de California.

## ¿Qué es el CADAA?

- La Solicitud de la Ley Dream de California permite a los estudiantes interesados en asistir a colegios, universidades y programas de educación profesional de California elegibles solicitar ayuda financiera estatal. Se envía antes de CADA año de universidad. La solicitud se abre el 1 de octubre (de 12º grado) y debe completarse antes del 2 de marzo. Esta solicitud no está relacionada con el programa federal de Acción Diferida para los Llegados en la Infancia (DACA).
